### ABA Worksheet Updates

In Section III of the ABA Form:

Under the signature block, there is a line that asks for “Printed Name and Title of Crewmember.”

One of the primary non-compliance issues stems from the fact that crewmembers forget to add their title (RN or EMT-P) after their printed name.

Even though clinician title is in several other places in the chart, Revenue Cycle considers this a standalone form so the title must be included.

**We have added REQUIRED title “buttons” under the printed name section to solve this issue.**

### Pediatric “reason” for use of Section II and Section III

Another common error in ABA compliance stems from use of the “wrong” reason in Section II- Circumstances that make it impractical for the patient to Sign). In evaluating the errors identified by Revenue Cycle, we realized that there was no option for the crew to select “Pediatrics” as the reason.

This issue has been corrected:
